A Family Plan for a NEW GENERATION

THE VISION

I must begin this book by sharing a vision the Lord gave me in about a special generation who will walk the earth before He returns. This generation is coming to prepare the way of the Lord. Some are already here, but many more **must come**. *"Let this be written for a future generation that a people not yet born may praise the Lord"* (Psalm 102:18). A large segment in this generation will be children and young people whom God will bring to earth in these final generations for *such a time as this*. **It is for the hope of these children that this book has been written ...** a great Mighty Warrior Generation.

"From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise ... to silence the foe and the avenger" (Psalm 8:2).

There is a generation coming who will walk with God as intimately as Enoch walked (Genesis 5:24). They will be so completely consumed with passion that they will be willing to follow the Lord wherever He leads and will be consumed with His purposes. They will be a living testimony in the earth, and will not be afraid of death nor fear martyrdom. *"They will not love their lives so much that they shrink back from death"* (Revelation 12:11). This will be a spiritual generation that will consist of people of all ages, yet within this generation there will be children unlike any the world has ever known.

The Bible says, *"A little child will lead them"* (Isaiah 11:6). Children play a significant role in softening the hearts of humanity because they possess a unique innocence and a tenderness that allows the Holy Spirit to have His way. Jesus reminded us that we cannot enter the kingdom of God unless we come as a child (Matthew 18:3), and that the kingdom of God belongs to the children (Matthew 19:14). The unified love for the Lord that these children and young people will possess will cause great spiritual waves to sweep the earth. The testimony of their lives will bring untold millions into the kingdom of God to join millions of other worshippers awaiting the return of their bridegroom Savior, Jesus Christ.

Many of these children will be the offspring of Godly bloodlines; the children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of the families who have followed the Lord throughout history. *"His children will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed"* (Psalm 112:2). These children will receive heightened spiritual gifts and possess ministry mantles as a result of the previous generation's faithfulness. These young children will be the arrows in the hands of parents who are mighty warriors for the Lord (Psalm 127:4). *"Fathers will tell their children about your faithfulness"* (Isaiah 38:19). Parents today are already seeing evidence of this coming generation as many of our children have spiritual awareness and gifts that are far advanced for their physical ages. The Body of Christ as a whole is seeing an increase of blessings on our children every day, and this will continue to increase in preparation for the seasons to come. Other children born in this mighty warrior generation will be born to parents who do not know God, but their children will find the Lord and lead their parents to Him.

While these special warriors are being created in God's secret place (the womb), they will be with God: *"You created my inmost being and You knit me together in my mother's womb"* (Psalm 139:13). It will be evident from birth that these children have a readiness to serve Him (Luke 1:15). Just like John the Baptist, these children will be born knowing their destiny before them.

"From birth I have relied on you; you brought me forth from my mother's womb. I will ever praise you" (Psalm 71:6).

This unique generation of children will possess characteristics that will remind us of righteous men of old. As the generational bloodlines of history complete themselves, the children and young people will follow in the way of their righteous ancestors. They will have the faith of Abraham, the humility of Moses, the conquering spirit of Joshua, the servant's heart of Ruth, the worshipper's heart of David, the prophetic eye of Jeremiah and Isaiah; they will dwell in the miraculous like Elijah, possess the boldness of Paul, and have the knowledge of Esther that they have come into the Kingdom *"for such a time as this"* (Esther 4:14).

They will be lights in the darkness of this world no matter where they go, and will not possess the fears of previous generations because they will be firmly rooted and established in the Lord. Their lack of fear will cause the Lord's hand to be upon them. (Luke 1:66) As they march in unison and only respond to the voice of the Holy Spirit, their lives will not be about themselves or fulfilling their own desires, but will be consumed with complete obedience to the Lord.

The enemy is also preparing his army for battle. Believers do not need to fear his army but we do need to be aware it exists. On the other side there are children being born who will be raised with the desire to promote the enemy's agenda by being taught to hate. Others will even be chosen in the womb through ceremonial rituals or other forms of evil. Their only hope is to find the Lord, but until they do they will be increasingly susceptible to the deeds and plans of the enemy.

As the people of the world sink deeper into the dark deceptions that will eventually lead them to embrace the ways, customs and lifestyles of the AntiChrist, both the Lord's army and Satan's army will continue to prepare. No matter when these events take place the truth is there will be a generation of people who will be alive on earth waiting for their beloved Bridegroom to come. THE VISION

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Please note these GENERATIONS:

SILENT GENERATIONS (1925-1943) Born and raised during the Great Depression; often into large families. For these families life was simple and divorce was rare. Love of country and obedience to parents was essential. Silent Generation parents believed *hard work lead to success*. This generation fought in and observed World War 2, which shaped their worldview.

BABY BOOMERS (1944-1961) Raised largely by the Silent Generations who after World War 2 desired to work hard, get good jobs and forget about tough times. Silent Generations birthed record numbers of children in one of the largest baby booms in American history. Because Baby Boomers were the first generation to see TV invading their homes, it shaped their world view. TV brought new ideas of child rearing, Dr. Spock, and the idea that smaller families would bring more material wealth and better parenting. TV families were often small and materialistically prosperous which laid a foundation for justifying birth control.

Post-Birth Control Pill Generations:

GENERATION X (1961-1984) Your grandparents did not plan their families and your parents did not plan theirs, but Baby Boomer parents rebelled against God's traditional plan. These were raised watching TV and its secular ideas promoting an attitude of life without God. Calling themselves the "ME" generation, boomer parents exchanged traditions for the pursuit of self-fulfillment and X-Ed out children to pursue their careers, money, power, and material wealth. Large families virtually disappeared in this generation. Abortions became legal in 1973 and killed the peers of your generation; your contemporaries. If you were conceived it is a miracle, because once the *birth control pill* was introduced it became conception was popularized as a woman's choice. The pill and easy abortions brought a sexual revolution which caused many of your parents to not stay married. They divorced forcing you into a blended family. The new idea that children *needed quality time, not quantity time* became popular as parents *worked and forced you* to endure hours of daycare alone. You are a nameless generation who felt dumped and abandoned. You rebelled as teens, causing teen pregnancy, suicide, sexual abuse and drug addiction rates to soar.

MILLENNIALS (1984-2001) Your parents adopted the idea that children must be "wanted" to have value; otherwise children should be aborted or prevented by birth control or sterilization. Your generation saw very few families with three or more children. Conceptions were planned and "wanted." Choice, age and economics caused your parents to limit their family size to one or two "wanted" children. This gave parents more money and time to spend on each child. Highly educated, two income parents put off childbearing. Your generation was the first to see working parents coming back home. However YOU became their next project. With parents back in the home some became highly involved pressuring children to perform. Your generation is over scheduled, overindulged and often spoiled and rarely told "no!" You have always been catered to and have been seriously over-parented but you are blessed to have been born at the right time in history, during a season of transitioning technology. Your generation is a powerhouse generation, full of technological planners, community shapers, institution builders, and world leaders.

PREFACE

As a forerunner, the message of this book is like the *voice of one calling in the desert, sounding an alarm to God's people; calling today's generations back to Him.*

"See I will send you the prophet Elijah before that great and terrible day of the Lord comes. He will turn the hearts of the Fathers back to the hearts of the children ...lest I come and strike the earth with a curse" (Malachi 4:5, 6).

The enemy can blind both believers and nonbelievers so that they miss the light of the glorious gospel of Christ (2 Corinthians 4:4).

In Birthing God's Mighty Warriors, I will expose an area where God's people have missed the light of God's glorious gospel. Recent generations were blindsided by the enemy and deceived into thinking that birthing God's children was not important anymore. Parents did not want to receive all the children that God had planned for their marriages. Their blindness caused them to make choices that brought death and destruction, and today's generations are suffering as the result of their sin.

He is sending us a clear call that it is time to wake up!

I am convinced this is a message that is burning in the heart of the Father for His people. It's hard to grasp how much is at stake at this time! A new generation is standing at a crossroad; which path will you choose? You may not be aware that the Lord wants you to consider having children (Genesis 1:28, Psalm 127:3-5). They are God's creation and a reflection of His glory. Even if you have all the children you think you wanted, or if you have not decided if you want more or if you have not even begun to start your family yet, the Lord wants to come upon you and grant you His blessing of

creating a new life. He wants to give each of us a new understanding of what it means to be given a child. Children play a vital role in God's plan for the future and in your vision of understanding God's great purposes for your life. God wants to show you how *birthing children is an act of worship*.

Birthing God's Mighty Warriors will begin a new adventure in God which will become a lifelong quest to follow the Lord in a new way of righteousness. As I take this age old theme of birthing children and shed some new light, you will discover an ancient path, and I pray that your generation will follow this ancient pathway back to obedience again.

God has something wonderful for YOU to discover.

When the Lord gave me this revelation about the importance of being open to birthing His children, it really was not something I was looking for. These truths have always been in God's word but we had never heard of them before, and we had both been attending church since we were born. I had read through the entire Bible many times, and in addition had read the book of Revelation several additional times and knew that this would be a volatile time on earth, but I had never stopped to think that I could personally have a part to play in birthing a person who might be on earth during the end of the age. These final generation of children and adults will usher in the return of the Lord. I had not grasped the idea that I, my children, my grandchildren or my great-grandchildren might take part or be that privileged. God showed me that I could birth the very people who take part in the final events of the book of Revelation! This alone is deep. Try to grasp this.

We are the chosen generations and the envied groups that are alive on planet earth at this critical time. Now more than ever we need to be clear about what God has said about birthing children so that we do not become confused with the ideas of society and the influence from those who do not bow the knee to Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior (Romans 14:11). Previous generations of God's people adopted the ways of the world and were deceived because they were not grounded in God's word. We know that Satan is a liar. (John 8:44.) It's time to expose his lies so that the light of the gospel can transform popular mindsets and turn a new generation toward the plans and purposes of the Lord.

It saddens me that many couples who are in the older generations may have already missed a large part of what God wanted to do through them. Unfortunately, this is what happens when a generation blends with the culture and chooses to follow the family planning ideas of a godless society. The last several generations rejected God's plan for the family, and it brought them disaster, death and destruction. Many in these generations are presently suffering from consequences that come from denying God's plan: reproductive cancers, divorce, loss of marital intimacy, great spiritual loss, sorrow and rejection. My prayer is that people from these generations will listen and repent and become healed if needed, and even possibly bear more children if the Lord desires this for them. Yet most importantly, if previous generations will repent, we can give testimony to a new generation and warn them to not make incorrect choices with their fertility. God will honor and restore previous generations for their humility.

Birthing God's Mighty Warriors is a message of hope for all generations to read, to think about and to absorb so that our future generations may be blessed. My prayer for each person who reads this book is that you will allow the Lord to open your heart and mind so you can discover God's plan for the family and experience the wonder of Birthing God's Mighty Warriors.

INTRODUCTION

Why do you have all these children? (Our Story)

If I had a dollar for every time someone asked me why we have so many children, I think I would be a rich woman. I guess coming across a large family has been a thing of the past for such a long time that seeing one still invokes curiosity. However, this is starting to change. Frequently we are seeing pictures of celebrities on tabloid covers boasting their growing bellies and their glorious plans for large families. Hollywood stars appear to be leading a new baby boom. Ever since terrorist events like "9/11/2001", the secular world seems to be embracing a new craving for children, a craving



which has not been seen for generations, and what is amazing is that they are moving forward in one of the desires of the Father's heart: to bless all people with children (Genesis 1:28). The Lord says that when His people will not praise Him He will let the rocks cry out (Luke 19:40). Maybe this is what is happening. The secular world has taken the lead because God's people have failed to do their part. God's people are no longer the ones leading the world by example, showing what it

means to have a Godly family full of children. In many of today's churches the ministers are still encouraging parents to limit their offspring by sterilization and birth control, which is accepted without protest. Often our ministers admit their practice of birth control to prevent children and that they or their spouse has been sterilized!

It is time for God's holy people to come out of this deception about God's gift of children!

My husband and I were raised in this darkness. We were raised in and were married during the generation that X-out children. Even though we grew up in Bible believing Protestant churches, our ministers did not teach us to love children the way that God loves them; as His children. Like sheep led astray, we were taught to embrace the ideas of our culture instead of God's word. We were told that birthing children was our choice and not God's. Our entire generation swallowed this deception, and if not for the grace of God we would have continued to swallow it too! In His mercy the Lord reached out of Heaven and freed us. Now our prayer is that we can

help free a new generation. We offer our story as a living testimony of what God can do in regular people's lives, and the reason for why I wrote *Birthing God's Mighty Warriors*.

I have always been the kind of person who asked theological questions that no one could answer. This happened often in my Sunday School classes and during the six years I attended Christian school. I would raise my hand and ask a very valid and thoughtful question, but the teacher either could not answer my question or, sometimes it seemed did not want to answer my question. Teachers often challenged me to go find the answer myself and report back. This usually sent me on a journey to find the answers in Scripture.



In 1995 I found myself once again asking questions for which no one seemed to have an answer. This time the subject was *family planning* and whether believers should consider sterilization. I was asking this because my husband had considered a vasectomy, and I was could not completely agreement. After a very disturbing dream he had, we sought counsel from Godly people, and neither of us could get satisfying answers. Again I asked questions that no one could answer, and again God graciously led me on a personal journey to search out His Scriptural truths. During this process I also found medical data to support my Scriptural conclusions. As I searched God's Word, what I found truly amazed me. I *discovered* God's beautiful plan for marriage and the family, which is something that no one had ever shared with me about during the 40 plus years that I had faithfully attended church.

My research has drawn me to the conclusion that many of God's dear people have no idea what God has to say about family planning in marriage. This should be of great concern, because we are at a pivotal time in the history of the world. My curiosity compelled me to ask questions that maybe God's people also need to be asking themselves, because God does have answers.¹

My most compelling conclusion was that most people do not realize how much God would like to have a say in what they choose to do with their family planning, and how much He desires to bless them with children!



My husband Christopher and I did not realize this, and we had both grown up in Christian homes, and both of us had attended church every Sunday since we were born. We were high school sweethearts after we met over thirty years ago at our church youth group. He says that it was love at first sight, and I agree. This year we celebrated our thirty second anniversary, and we have a wonderful marriage based on Scripture and mutual agreements. We both received Christ as our Savior when we were very

young, and we both grew up knowing and loving the Lord. His grace has kept us faithfully serving Him for more than forty years.

Presently, we have eight children, and if the Lord wants to bless us with more we would also like that very much. Every time we have another child, my husband says, *"I think we are done,"* and jokes that he wants to name the baby, "finale" meaning final. Yet each time God has surprised us with the blessing of another little Scott child. We believe that staying open to God's voice in this area of our lives is what He desires of us; however, we have not always been open to this possibility, instead we used to feel the exact opposite.

When we first got married in 1980 in the height of the feminist's movement and we both agreed that, like those in our culture, *"We did not want a large family."* We were very positive that we didn't ever want any children. I would tell people, *"I don't want anyone calling me mommy."* Yet periodically we would discuss the possibility of children, and we were positive that since I was from a family of three children and my husband was from a family of five children, that two children, if any, would definitely be more than enough for us. We both felt that a large family would be expensive and would require work, and we wanted the freedom to do other things with our lives instead of being burdened with raising children. Also, we could not see the purpose of having a large family. Even though we had both been brought up in Bible believing homes and churches, neither of us had ever heard a sermon on the subject of family planning and were ignorant about God's truths concerning families. We formed our beliefs and attitudes from movies, TV, society, comments in our Sunday School classes, and from other couples we met through our church or in our neighborhood.



At every church we have ever attended, we knew couples who had been sterilized. After we turned thirty five, we began to notice increasing numbers of couples in our age group who were sharing their sterilization stories with us. Usually one would make a comment about how the husband was not feeling because he had just been *"fixed."* They would laugh and joke about his health not being *"quite up to snuff,"* or the man would share how his wife had just gotten her tubes tied after the delivery of their last baby and how happy he was that he would not have to *worry* about any more children coming.

Every time I heard one of these couples tell their stories, I would ask Christopher if their story bothered him, and he would tell me, *"They have a right to do what they want, and besides, children cost money and they don't want that burden."* I understood what Christopher was telling me, but each time I heard a sterilization story something inside me would cringe and my spirit would let out a heartfelt cry. I knew that these people loved the Lord, but something was not right about the idea of sterilization. My heart was aching for them and I was mourning a loss, but I really did not know why, nor could I understand why I cared. After all, it really was not any of my business. This nagging feeling always occurred whenever the subject was discussed. I just knew that something was not quite right and that the spirit of God was trying to tell me something.

When I was growing up in the 1960s and 1970s, it was becoming increasingly popular for women to be on *the pill* and to have their tubes tied. I remember that my mother was against both of these options. She was a preacher's daughter, and her parents never used birth control. Even though my mother used birth control herself, she thought *the pill* was evil. She believed that it was making the idea of having an affair look desirable and being a health and vitamin advocate she felt it was bad for a woman's long term health. Many of her friends were suffering complications as the result of being on *the pill*, and my mom cautioned me that using unnatural and artificial hormones affect a person's long-term health. When I was getting married she persuaded me not to go on *the pill*, but my OB/GYN prescribed it anyway. Being eighteen and in college, I especially did not want to get pregnant. So in the beginning of our marriage, I reluctantly went on it. Thankfully it made me ill, and I stopped taking it several months later.

I remember also how my mother was very opposed to a woman getting her tubes tied. She thought this was also wrong and went against God's plan. She would always tell me not to ever have my tubes tied because, *"You never know if you might want to have more children someday, and it is unscriptural for a person to make assumptions about their future."*

My mother often tried to talk her friends out of their decisions to have their tubes tied, but most of the time their mind was made up and her suggestion fell on to deaf ears. Later, every women admitted they regretted their decisions and were struggling emotionally or physically to live with the consequences of their choices. Seeing these older women suffer caused me to develop my own opinion on this subject, even though I had not really thought it out. My opinion was not a Scriptural opinion but a rational idea based on my mother's wisdom and these other women's mistakes. I knew that I would never want to have my tubes tied, but Christopher felt differently about male sterilization.

As Christopher tells, *"I was raised in a churchgoing family with five children, and we did not have the luxuries that many families enjoy today. Once we began to have children, the financial lack that I had grown up with caused me to want a small family so that I could give them the things that I had never enjoyed. After we had our son Shawn in 1983 (when Rachel was 21 years old and I was 24 years old), I was content to never have any more children. Yet after a few years, Shawn kept asking for a sibling, and I think it wore Rachel down, and she started yearning for a daughter to make our family feel complete. Since Shawn's birth, we had discussed having two children. Rachel finally convinced me that she would be unfulfilled if we did not at least try to have a little girl. I finally agreed, but the cost of another child weighed heavily in my mind. I didn't want the burden of a large family, and to me a family of two children was very large!"*

When our son was four years old, God blessed us with a beautiful daughter, Ashley, in 1988. We both felt that our family was now completed. We were both under thirty years old and neither one of us wanted sterilization yet, but in our minds we were finished having children. We would tell people, "We're done!"



Both Christopher and I always feared pregnancy, so we were extremely careful to use a contraceptive every time we made love. We were never careless, and were very confident that we were in control of our situation. Three

years after Ashley's birth, I got very sick with what I thought was a flu virus and I found that I was pregnant. We were both in shock! Both of us were upset, but particularly Christopher. He kept saying, "*How did this happen? How did this happen?*" Neither one of us wanted more children and felt that God had let us down. As the pregnancy progressed, we began to get used to the idea of having another child. I still didn't understand what God was doing or why He was doing it. We were so entrapped with the mindset that children were supposed to be our choice and not God's that we were both blinded to the blessing of children. I came to the conclusion that God must know a really good reason why we needed another child, because I couldn't figure it out myself. When Heather was born she was absolutely beautiful, and I realized how much I really wanted another baby. When I saw her, I repented for thinking, "*I knew what was best for my life.*" As if in an instant, the shackles came off my eyes. Immediately I felt, "*She is a miracle, she is perfect, and I absolutely loved her!*"



God always knows what our heart needs far more than we do. At Heather's birth I think Christopher was in shock; she was so small and beautiful. When he held her for the first time I joked, "You're sure that you don't want to send her back?" and Christopher said, "She's a keeper!" I think at that moment we both felt we were part of a bigger plan; because God had given us a child we had not anticipated.

Christopher loved our new daughter from the moment he first saw her, but he continued to be upset about our family finances and the growing cost of their needs. Christopher's feelings were mixed: *"I was a builder and was running my own business at the time, and the nature of my business made our finances very unpredictable. When we were experiencing our leaner months, I was afraid I would be raising children I could not afford. I did not want to see my children miss the same things I had missed. The reality that this could happen to them upset me*

greatly. God was watching over us faithfully, but it was not easy. Looking back, we managed somehow, but both Rachel and I had to work and it was very hard to make ends meet. There was a great fear that even though Rachel always had a part-time job, if something ever happened to me, our finances would sink."

We began to enjoy parenting more than we thought we would. We took some parenting courses and learned about how to properly discipline our children while trying to not become angry or unkind. We were successful most of the time. We also taught our children manners and took them to church. Our family was sweet and our children were very loving but there were increasing financial pressures on Christopher. He felt the burden of raising three children and was always worried about finances.



Three years later we experienced a birth control failure with a condom, and I became pregnant again. We were both shocked and upset. Again we were not thinking of the great joy that another child would bring us. This time Christopher was really distressed. *"I could not understand why God was bringing added responsibility to me and why my children might not be able to have the things I had envisioned for them. I wanted them to go to private school, be able to join sports teams, take after-school lessons, and have opportunities to travel. With finances as tight as they were and now another child on the way, I saw myself slipping deeper and deeper into a deep hole which I thought I would never come out of."* During this pregnancy Christopher began to talk about getting a vasectomy. *"I wanted an end to the possibility of any more pregnancies!"* It was not that Christopher did not love our children, he was and is a very caring and loving father. It was the financial responsibility of supporting them and their future lives that concerned him so much.

During this pregnancy, the more he talked about getting a vasectomy, the more upset I became. I did not believe in sterilization, and because of how I always felt when other people talked about it I knew somehow it was not the right thing to do. Yet Christopher wanted to get a vasectomy, and pressured me but I simply could not agree. I was pregnant and emotional and was not sure if I wanted this child to be my last one. Every time we talked about it he became very angry with me, and we always had a big fight. Deep down I just knew that God was doing something with us, but I couldn't put my feelings into words. I didn't even understand my feelings; I just knew that they were there. During this pregnancy our finances hit a big slump, even though Christopher worked harder than ever. Christopher recalls, *"As I felt the unbearable financial pressures closing in on me, it seemed like Rachel didn't care. I had to do something and take charge of our situation before it was too late. We were living in a southern city that was saturated with billboards advertising a 'no-scalpel vasectomy with quick results.' I called the clinic to price the surgery."*



At the birth of Courtney, our fourth child, Christopher was again very happy, but he was also anxiously waiting for my agreement to get the vasectomy. I was struggling very much with this decision; I just could not find any peace about it. Since we could not agree, and we did not have any Scripture to guide us, Christopher decided to seek counsel from our pastor. Our pastor was and is a wonderful man of God, but he did believe in vasectomies. He often talked of how he was planning to get one for his 40th birthday. Even though he did not see anything wrong with getting a vasectomy himself and felt that the vasectomy would end Christopher's financial fears, he gave very good counsel that this kind of decision must be one of agreement between a man and his wife.

He advised Christopher not to get a vasectomy unless I would agree with him. After Christopher

saw our pastor, he came home and told me what he had said. Again I could not agree, so we had another big fight about it. I couldn't let go of something in my heart, and I also did not like the idea of surgery to break something in the body that is working. That part bothered me greatly. Even when vasectomies were being advertised as completely safe and healthy, I wasn't convinced there wouldn't be consequences to his health. Our disagreement left us at a serious stalemate, waiting for one of us to change our minds, and this was when God supernaturally stepped in.

One night, a short while after Courtney's birth, Christopher had a dream. *"First, I saw a huge warrior angel of the Lord appear before me. The angel was as big as the sky. I then saw that he was holding a very large flaming sword. The angel then raised the sword up high into the air. It looked as if he was going to war with the sword. He then turned the sword toward me and aimed the flaming tip directly (as if touching) my male genitalia, and the angel said, 'DO NOT ABORT THE PLAN OF THE LORD!' Immediately I woke up. I was freaked out, to say the least, and in shock. I woke Rachel, and she says that I was the color of death, gray in my face, and we both remember that I could barely breathe. She grabbed the phone to call 911, thinking that I was having a heart attack. I stopped her, and when I could finally talk I told her what the angel had said. We both had no idea what this dream really meant, but*

Rachel said something to the effect of, 'Wow! This is big. This is really big.' Yet both of us were perplexed about the true meaning of the dream. Rachel said she felt like something great was going to happen or someone great is coming through our family lineage for God to intervene like this, but still the dream troubled us both greatly."

Immediately after the dream Christopher decided to cancel the vasectomy, but we were both confused about what God was saying. Because God is so faithful in His love for us, the Holy Spirit began to show me in scripture and I began sharing what I was reading. The Lord began to open both of our eyes to the truths in God's Word concerning children. Yet Christopher was not completely convinced he was still very concerned about how we were going to afford four children and possibly even more in the future. Our finances had already been in a lean period during this pregnancy, and we had not recovered, even though Christopher continued to work very hard. God was merciful to us. I believe the Lord was working on Christopher's heart and mine. After that dream, Christopher would say he would not mind raising a larger family if we at least had the money to do it. He began to be more open to God and began to believe He had a Scriptural plan for families that we knew little about. He switched jobs and gained more knowledge in his career field, and the Lord began to bless him. The more open he became to allowing God to show him His plan for our fertility, the more the Lord blessed him. This was during the time, the Lord was showing us His plan in Scripture. I wanted to find out what God said about children, and Christopher wanted to see if there were any references in scripture about vasectomies. As the Lord revealed His truths with us and we began to share them with each other, our growing agreement led God to show us His hand at work over our family in a way that we had never imagined before.

After the angel dream, we still continued to use condoms, but God was revealing His plan to us in Scripture and we were growing in our faith. It took almost four years after the dream for us to clearly understand that children were a gift from God and that God wants to give them to us. Once we both understood God's plan, we agreed to stop using condoms so that we could possibly have a fifth child. When I did get pregnant, Christopher was no longer upset at the thought of another child; he was very excited instead. This was a true testimony of how God had used His truths from Scripture and our circumstances to



change his heart and mine. During the fifth pregnancy Christopher said, *"I liked telling people that my wife was pregnant with our fifth child, just to see their reaction – especially at church where we had already been so persecuted for having what was appearing to be a very large family for a Protestant. It did not bother me when the rudest remarks were made by believers, who always gave me a negative response. I no longer cared as much about what they thought. Somehow Rachel and I both knew that this child was going to be a very special blessing, and that God had chosen to do something very special through us."*



On the way to the hospital we both agreed that if it was a boy, his name would be **Judah**, which means "Praise." Since we are a family that loves to worship and sing together, we felt that adding another worshipper to our crew would be quite a blessing. Judah came into our life on Mother's Day morning 1999, with all the children present, and several of my special girlfriends.

When I got home from the hospital, I looked up the story of Rachel and Leah in Genesis and was amazed to read the Scriptural account of these two women and their competition to bear children for Jacob. When Leah had Judah she said, "This time I will praise the Lord!" With tears in my eyes I realized why we had named our baby Judah. With this fifth child, this time we had praised the Lord! God had changed both of our hearts and our attitudes about children. We began to grow in our faith to trust God more, and now we highly valued our ability to receive God's gift of life.

After Judah was born, the Lord began to really convict our hearts about trying to control our *family planning*. The Lord placed a deep desire in both of us to give this area of our lives completely over to Him, but even with all the Scriptural truths that God had already revealed to us we were both really scared. This was a new reality for us. We had never trusted the Lord with our family plan before. We were not sure we could trust the Lord with something as great as the size of our family. As we never completely figured out how we conceived Heather, our third child. It had always been the joke between us that, "We are so fertile that we don't even have to have sex to get pregnant."



Trusting God with this area of our lives could mean many, many more children. Yet the more we prayed about it and read the Word, we felt as if the Lord was trying to persuade us to at least be open to allowing Him to choose the size of our family. This was a huge step of faith for us because the other couples and family members around us were not following in the same footsteps. Exclusively we were the only ones in our group who had not gotten fixed. Our actions stuck out like a sore thumb. We had to be very brave to trust God to move us forward. We had no one to follow, no book, no manual, no tape series, simply our agreement, scripture

that had never been interpreted this way to us before and the voice of the Holy Spirit. It was scary!

It had been spoken in prayer over our family that after the birth of our fifth child we would be experience a time of great breakthroughs. A month before Judah was born, Christopher and I saw the beginning of God's financial miracle. He was recruited to a new project, we moved from Atlanta to Orlando and he received a \$25,000 raise! This was the first sign of God's hand moving upon our finances in more than 10 years! The new salary broke us over a financial barrier that we had never before surpassed. We learned the secret to prosperity when it comes to the argument of not having enough money for children. God never brings the increase until after the child is born. God's Word says, *"The children of the righteous will not have to beg for bread" (Psalm 37:25). He will provide for His children once they are born.*



Not too long after Judah's birth, we decided to stop using condoms. We decided that God knew better than we do what would make us happy. Thankfully, we conceived another child. We had never had children this close together before! If we had tried to control things we probably would have waited a little longer, but God knew that it was time for these children to be born! Destiny was born in 2001 and came as the result of trusting the Lord with our family planning. With this new daughter we did not have a name picked out for her until we drove out of the hospital

parking lot, when suddenly the name **Destiny** came to me. I knew that the Lord was giving me this thought. We had received a valuable treasure in learning to trust God in this area. This trust has placed the destiny of our family in the Lord's hands instead of our own. Shortly after her birth Christopher finished his project and was reassigned a new one and his salary increased another \$20,000! His salary was now double what his salary was when we started on this journey all so many years before. God was doing another financial miracle, because all of Christopher's fears had been money related and God was putting the money where we could see it.

In 2002, we were surprised again with a little daughter that we named **Haven**. Our home and family have become our haven of rest, happiness, laughter, and joy. In 2004 we were blessed again with our 8th child, **Leviticus**. We were so excited to have a third boy! Since the birth of Haven and Leviticus, Christopher's salary **had now tripled** what it was seven years before when we started on this journey to let God show us His best.

We often wonder what we would be doing if the Lord had not blessed us with this many children. If it had been left up to us, we would have only had the first two. Then we would probably both be working full-time jobs. Christopher says maybe we would have taken a few more vacations or bought our children a few more luxuries. Surely there would have been more money to spoil our children with. Yet somehow we don't seem to miss those things as much as we would have missed the noise of the younger siblings opening presents on



the holidays or the noise that came from our entire family cheering for our oldest daughter as she graduated from high school or the laughter each night around the dinner table. A few more material items would have been as cheap trinkets compared to the joy that my older children have received from their younger counterparts. Often their friends told them how blessed they were, even in the chaos of so many people living under one roof. Now that the older ones are growing up, graduating High School and college and getting married and all the while that I am still raising their younger siblings, I often wonder what life might be like had I not had the last four? Definitely boring and not nearly as much fun!



The SCOTT FAMILY is not sharing this story of our family to tell you that we are anything out of the ordinary. This book you are about to read is a labor of love. It took me over seven years to write and seven years since I've been teaching it. The topic is so vast, one could spend a lifetime embracing the beauty of the message. As you read the pages of **Birthing God's Mighty Warriors**, I pray that the Lord will help you see that family planning is something that our loving Heavenly Father cares greatly about. I believe that God will speak something special to each person who reads this great

CHAPTER 1



MARY, CAN I BORROW YOUR WOMB?

The womb, which houses the unborn baby, is a special place of mystery where God perfects His creation. Every woman has the opportunity to allow God to use her womb. There are many blessings, some obvious and some hidden, for the woman who walks this road with God – the woman who is willing to be God's handmaiden.

As the mother of eight children, I have had the wonderful opportunity of being able to give birth eight times. On each occasion, as my Heavenly Father allows a *beautiful little child* to come into my life, I am becoming more aware of *His great love* for me. Through the miracle of birth, I am being given the privilege of *bringing forth* a person who can become a *mighty warrior* for God. As a woman, I am being allowed the opportunity to birth, train and help each of my children to find a personal relationship with the Lord. It thrills me to be able to participate in this magnificent process called *motherhood*.

Throughout the birthing process God seems to be giving me a deeper understanding of the awesome role that He has reserved exclusively for the female. As each woman gives of herself to God, she helps to fulfill His desire to bring to earth the generations of man. The wonder of birth allows women to participate with God in fulfilling His vision for humanity. Through the miracle of birth, women can experience His creative power as new life passes through their bodies and comes to this planet! WOW!

A FEMALE'S "LIFE-CALLING" IS CONNECTED TO HER WOMB

If we stood outside of a Protestant or Catholic Church today and polled the women coming out of the services, I bet we would find that few women could tell us that *they are certain* about what God has called them to do. It seems that not many people clearly understand what God wants them to do with their lives. Knowing God's plan and *purpose* is perhaps one of the biggest sources of confusion among God's people today. This may be why books like "*The Purpose Driven Life*" by Rick Warren sold over 25 million copies. Everywhere people seem to be walking around *dumbfounded* about why God put them on this earth. People flock to churches looking for their purpose. They take church courses and learn about their *faith*. Usually they are told that they need to share what they have learned with others but this still does not satisfy their curiosities. Most people, even those who do not follow a religion, feel certain they have a specific purpose. The *enemy* has been very successful confusing people everywhere about what

their purpose might be. He has confused the sexes and clouded God's traditional roles. Men and women used to understand why they were created to be different, but now society *has become unisex*, and the roles of men and women have blended so much so that today's people cannot see even the *most obvious course* for their lives; nor do they understand the purposes their hearts are crying for.

From the very beginning of creation God told ALL humans to "*be fruitful and multiply.*" He gave people a calling to procreate and replenish the earth with more people. This was given to *humanity as a task*, a job, something to do. To achieve success at this God-given assignment, God created males and females with specific differences in their physical anatomy. The female's body is different from the male's, and vice versa. Both bodies were created for *procreation*. For the female to be successful, God created her with an added bonus. She was a *man creature* with a womb; a *womb-man!* Only her body could house, nurture, and feed another human being.

What is interesting is that God gave Eve the womb *before* Adam and Eve sinned, not afterwards. God's plan all along was to use the female's body to be the house of new life. This particular role had not been given to Adam. *God planned* something else for Him. He would donate, while she would create. Together the female egg and male sperm would grow a beautiful new person (*Isaiah 64:8*). Each would participate, but God clearly separated the female from the male. Her role in creation would be particularly special. The act of housing God's creation was unmistakably meant for the female.

Ladies, the fact that we get to take part in creation should really excite you. Women get to touch and feel and take part in creating a new human being with God (*Psalms 100:3*). The men do not get this privilege. All they can do is watch and wait, but we get to *experience God's power* as it happens inside of our bodies! We get to meet *God's creation* before anyone else can. Mothers are *FIRST* in God's plan. Our pleasure is to experience God's creation (*Genesis 18:12*). This pleasurable bonding time is God's way of saying, "*Thank you*" to females for allowing Him to use our physical bodies.

Being able to *grow new life* is a very special event for a woman, and yet it is not always something that a woman wants to experience. The *thought* of pregnancy: the weight gain, the discomforts, the sleepless nights, and then afterward dealing with a screaming baby are all factors that make some women afraid and unwilling to *surrender* themselves to this all-consuming task. As a woman, I can *sympathize* with these women in their hesitation. Pregnancy can be very hard physically, and caring for young children *is a major sacrifice*. Furthermore raising children involves a lifetime of sacrifices! Yet God can and does honor woman's choices and sends supernatural grace (*2 Corinthians 9:8*). Even with God's help, some women still perceive the whole *ordeal* as too overwhelming for them.

Can God understand a woman's struggles with the process of motherhood? I believe that He can and does! The Bible reveals the beautiful love of the *Father's heart* for women and their willingness to take part in the birthing process through the encounter of the angel Gabriel and the Virgin Mary. The Lord *cared* about the thoughts and feelings of Mary so much that He sent an angel to announce His plans to her and to get a response from this *very special* young woman.

In order for us to grasp the *depth* of this visitation, it is necessary to separate ourselves from the viewpoints of our Western culture and try to understand this event in the *cultural period* in which it occurred. In Biblical times, it was the custom for men to treat women with very little

respect. *Women* were often viewed as having menial value and were often treated as *subhumans*. Most women were denied their basic rights and could easily be *bought or sold* if their husband or master wished to do so.

God *did not* see Mary this way. The *honorable* way that God treated Mary revealed how He views females. He cared about Mary and valued her as a *person* and as a woman. His *desire* was for Mary to be happy. He did not want to impose His will on a young maiden who may not have wanted the responsibility of caring for the *Savior of the World*. God knew that this was going to be a big job for a mother, and He cared enough about her to send an angel to announce His plans and to hear from *Mary's lips* that she would be willing to surrender her life for this *purpose*.

In the gospel of Luke (1:28-38) we can read the account of the angel Gabriel's visit to the Virgin Mary. God sent Gabriel down from Heaven to tell Mary that she was *highly favored* of the Lord and that God was with her. He also said that soon she would be with child and that this child would be *special*, for he would be the *Savior of all humanity*. What we need to understand in this passage is that God did not send Gabriel to tell Mary that she must birth Jesus. Gabriel came to announce God's plan and to see if Mary was *willing to agree* with and to submit to God's plan.

After giving Mary the details of how this would come about, the angel waited for Mary's reply ... *Mary had a choice to make*.

Through the angel, God was asking, "*Mary, can I borrow your womb? Mary, can I use you?*"

God was seeking her willingness to birth Jesus and her agreement with His plan. What Mary needed to decide was if she wanted to have this child and sacrifice her life for this purpose.

She could have given Gabriel a contemporary answer, "*Tell God, 'No, thank You.' I have other more important things to do with my life right now. Joseph and I want to spend time with each other before we have children, and Joseph just started his carpentry business and he needs to build up his clientele first before we bring children into this world, and we need to get a house first and set up housekeeping, and we want to do some traveling to Egypt and the Greek Isles, and I need to focus on my career and find my place in this world. Raising a child will take work, and I don't want to waste my time doing that right now. Yet tell God, 'Thanks for thinking of me.'*"

Of course, we know that she did not say anything like this, but that her response was an overwhelming "*Yes! Do unto me according to what you have spoken. I am God's servant and He can use me (my womb and physical body to house and nurture the Savior of the world). I am a willing participant!*"

Mary made a wise choice. Her first love was toward God, and this love made her open to His plans and purposes over her own wishes and desires. Her willingness to cooperate created a place for her in God that caused her to be blessed above all women (Luke 1:42). She said, "*From now on all the nations of the earth will call me blessed*" (Luke 1:48).

Our wonderfully loving God valued the wishes of Mary enough to give her a choice. God knew Mary's heart and knew that she would say, "*Yes,*" but I believe if Mary had said, "*no,*" then God would not have used her. God's way is never to force *servant-hood* on anyone, but to find people who are willing to be open to his plan (Psalm 2:11; Isaiah 56:6; Revelation 7:15; 22:3).

God did not want to *force* Mary to become the mother of Jesus, and He is not looking to force any woman to become a mother. God was seeking Mary's *willing heart* to participate with Him. The *God of the Universe* knows the stress that pregnancy and birth can bring. He also knows the fears many women have concerning motherhood. It can be exhaustive! God knows that it is not easy to birth children and raise children. It is a *role* that any person could easily discount as being too much trouble, especially in a culture which does not value sacrifices that seem insignificant.

Women *want* their time on earth to have value, but often view motherhood as a small contribution because it appears to be basic. We've allowed God's most *sacred role* to become devalued, and we've allowed *secular feminists* to tell women that they must do more and be more. This is why women feel pressured to be *more than just mothers*. To God, bearing children is no ordinary role. The act of bringing forth life is a powerful spiritual act, and when females give in to *God's plan*, they become immensely fulfilled in their *lifelong purpose*. Being a mother is a major part of the happiness that God intended for women to experience while on earth. To *nurture is an innate gift*. When a woman gets to act out her nurture gifting, it satisfies many of the deepest needs of her heart. Furthermore, the *blessing of motherhood* crosses all denominational lines, racial lines and global separations, and unites all females into one main objective that gives great joy.

This was God's intention from the beginning to join the heart of the female to His heart. We carry His heart within our heart. Women more than men know what it means to love another person the way God loves. He gives us His heart through the miracle of motherhood!

Are you willing to be used? Motherhood is an amazing gift, but it needs to be embraced. A woman can say, "No" to the Father. Today God is looking for women with willing hearts who will say, "Yes." He is still looking for women who, *like Mary*, will be willing to lay down their lives for the sake of the call—women who will look past what society has said their own *personal plans* and dreams should be, and see that motherhood is their *highest calling!* God is looking for those handmaidens who will say to Him, "Do unto me according to your word. I am a *willing servant*"—women who will see their wombs as holy unto the Lord, who will lay their lives upon the altar just like Mary did, and who will say,

"Lord, I lay my life and my personal agenda down so that You can bless me. Please give me children. I want to see my children be mighty spiritual warriors and be a blessing to others. I will allow You to keep my womb and my heart open so that Your plans will come forth on the earth. Please use ME, Lord!"

THE WOMB IS A PLACE OF HOLY SIGNIFICANCE TO GOD

It is a fact that a woman is given a *womb*. How many women focus on this *physical marvel*? To most women, a womb is something women have, but is a body part which is rarely talked about. Unlike breasts, which are visible to the outside world, *wombs are hidden*, and even though they are a part of a female's *physical* makeup, women usually do not sit around discussing their wombs unless they are telling a medical horror story. Wombs are *not bragged* about or compared from one woman to the next. In our society, wombs have not gained the focus of our attention.

Most Godly women do not realize that the Bible actually talks about this amazing organ and places a high value upon it (*Judges 13:5, Psalm 139:13, Isaiah 49:1, Jeremiah 1:5, Luke 1:15*). God gave the womb to women for a very important reason, and the Bible tells us some wonderful things about the *female womb*. One of the clearest truths is that Jesus came to earth through His mother's womb. This is an interesting *observation*.

Why did Jesus, the Savior of the World have to come to earth through a womb?

God could have brought Jesus here through another passageway instead of a womb: One day *Jesus* could have just appeared on earth as a *grown man teaching* in the temple, or . . . He could have made a grand entrance by flying in on a cloud, or The angel *Gabriel* could have visited Mary and handed her a *supernatural infant*.

God did not have to choose the womb of an *ordinary young woman* unless there is something about the womb, something so *magnificent*, so supernatural, so amazing that even God Himself had to *enter earth through this doorway*. What was God communicating when He chose to submit to the womb?

THE WOMB IS THE ONLY DOORWAY TO EARTH!

God spoke and the world came into existence (*Genesis 1:3*). God took dust and formed man and woman in His image (*Genesis 1:26*). After the creation of Eve, God rested (*Genesis 2:2*). God was finished. Since the female was now here, God's *plan* was for no other human to ever come to earth by God's direct hand. God had a new door: the womb. The womb had been created, and now every human must first be *conceived* by two humans, *grown inside* the female womb, and then make the *transition* from the womb to the world. God never chose any other door in the history of humankind to allow people to come to earth except the human womb! It is a *requirement* that every soul experience the womb even if ever so brief. God has clearly made the womb the only passageway to earth!

This is significant! God allowed Enoch and Elijah to *leave earth* without exiting through the death's door (as both were taken directly to Heaven), but God will not allow a human soul to enter earth *without* the female womb. *It is not possible!* Nicodemus had understanding of this physical passageway when he questioned Jesus about being born again in *John 3:4*: "Surely [a man] cannot enter a second time into His mother's womb to be born!"

GOD IS THE KEEPER OF THE DOOR TO EARTH

Since Scripture so clearly establishes that the womb is the only doorway to earth, then God must be the keeper of the door! For *no soul* comes to earth unless God allows them to come — *no one!*

By His choice God *needs the women*. As the doorkeeper, God has to find an *available* female womb and open it to bring a new human to earth. Because He is omnipotent He could have chosen to not use the woman or let her enjoy this pleasure. Instead He has never ceased from touching the female womb with *His life giving power*. This is a fascinating fact of God.

THE WOMB IS THE FIRST WAY FOR A HUMAN TO EXPERIENCE GOD

In *Psalms 139*, King David describes the womb as being an experience with God, as if it is a special time of preparation: “*He who made you and formed you in the womb*” (*Isaiah 44:2*). This holy preparation was something that God made part of the human experience.

“You created my inmost being and knit me together in my mother’s womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Your works are wonderful; I know that very well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place; when I was woven together in the depths of the earth your eyes saw my unformed body” (*Psalms 139:13-16*).

David said, “*You watched me Lord; Your eyes saw my unformed body.*” Inside the womb God watches. He is the caretaker of our creation. David also calls the womb the *secret place*. It only exists inside of a female’s womb. This special place is where God knits together the soul and spirit of every new *human being*. God prepared *Himself* in this location, as well as David and the other prophets and saints of old. Every one was prepared in God’s *mysterious space*. This incredible place is a quiet sanctuary filled with God’s sacred presence. Technology is not supposed to set its eyes or to invade or disturb God’s holy work unless it is an absolute emergency because this place is where the human soul is in His presence while soul and spirit are knitted together by Him. This area is where *holiness abounds*, this undisclosed place is God’s. It is not of this world; as David says, it is hidden in the depths of the earth; a spiritual pocket deep inside the realm of the Father. This spiritual dwelling place is not understood by man. *The womb is a mystery and very close to the eyes of the Father.*

***The womb is where God prepared Himself.
The womb is where God will prepare the next generation!***

David’s marvelous illustration in *Psalms 139* establishes the womb as a secret place of holiness where creation transpires in the presence of *Father God*. We can surmise that something supernatural is happening inside the womb of every pregnant mother. Perhaps God speaks to the *little person* being formed; maybe each soul experiences the reality of God’s presence before birth; maybe even previews their lives. *Who knows but God alone?* The Bible does not describe the details of our womb experience, but we each had one, and David leads us to *believe* that something very *special and significant* to God’s plan and to our purpose happens deep inside the female womb. There had to be a reason why the King of Kings and Lord of Lords voluntarily submitted to being inside of a *woman’s womb* and why He came to earth through this door. Can we even begin to grasp that there must be something supernatural to gain from going through the conception to birth experience—something so vital that even *God wanted to put Himself* through the process!

The *fact* that God submitted to the womb tells us that to participate in birth is a holy event for everything God does is holy. The womb experience must be a *very important part* of what it means to be both holy and human. For God chose both. Just as Scripture establishes that the womb is a doorway, it also describes it in another *incredible way*.

THE WOMB IS A PLACE WHERE LIFE ASSIGNMENTS ARE GIVEN

"In His hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all mankind" (Job 12:10).

The Bible also *speaks* about the womb as being a place where people are chosen and given life's assignments. In the same way that Jesus was chosen before conception, the Bible tells of other people who were chosen and then set apart for *God's service* while still in the womb.

❖ *Samson* was chosen in the womb to be a Nazarite and set apart for God (Judges 13:5).

❖ *Isaiah* was chosen in the womb to be a prophet (Isaiah 49:1).

❖ *Jeremiah* was called by God from the womb to be a prophet (Jeremiah 1:5).

❖ *John the Baptist* was filled with the Holy Spirit from the womb (Luke 1:15).

❖ *The Apostle Paul* was chosen in the womb to preach to the Gentiles (Galatians 1:15).

DOES GOD HAVE HIS OWN WOMB?

Does God have a womb? The Nation of Israel was made and formed in God's spiritual womb to be set apart as a nation unto Him (Isaiah 44:2, 24; 49:1, 5).

The Bible speaks of the spiritual womb as being an origination point for God's creation, from which the sea bursts forth (Job 38:8), where ice and frost are born (Job 38:29), and where the dawn originates (Psalm 110:3). This womb of creation is hidden from man, as Job stated in Job 42:3: *as "things too wonderful for man to know."* No place in Scripture do we find a reference that humans come out of God's womb.

Does God have a physical womb? Apparently not. Scripture says that God has loins (Ezekiel 1:27), but it does not tell us that He has a physical womb. *Instead*, the Bible clearly illustrates that God borrows the female womb so that He can bring forth the supernatural physical creation of each *new human soul*.

Therefore a woman's womb must be God's! Wow!

Could God have created a physical womb for Himself? Of course; *He is God*. He can have whatever He wants. Yet as far as we can interpret Scripture, God has not chosen to give Himself a physical womb. Instead He has chosen to borrow the womb from the female and to make her womb the place where *He knits spirit and soul within the physical body*. The supernatural marries the natural inside the female's womb!

Most women have not even begun to grasp what an *awesome privilege* it is to have been created female. God gave us a WOMB! It is time that we open our eyes to see that our womb is very valuable. A womb is something that no man has and no man can ever have!

"I am woman; hear me roar!" Women need to roar with great joy that we were created female and

have been given a womb! It is a special place of new beginnings happening inside of us and should never be taken for granted or complained about, for He accomplishes *His purposes through our physical bodies!* The female's part in creation is extremely special.

The *men have no idea* what is going on inside the heart of a woman as a new life is being created inside of her physical body. Every little kick and movement is a reminder of a mother's *thoughts, plans, and dreams for the coming child*. This is a privilege that God chose to give exclusively to females. No male on the earth will ever be able to experience the same anticipation that a female feels as she looks forward to the birth of her child. She *anticipates while he watches*. She feels while he waits. She *experiences* the depths of creation while he observes. Males will never understand her expectations of the first time she will hold her precious little baby in her arms and comfort its little cries and cancel all its fears. *The female grasps creation!* Males cannot! The female, along with God, takes part in the miracle. She touches God while He touches her heart.

Ladies, do you grasp how much God loves women? He gives to us and *prepares us* and gives us a special heart for our child. He knits our hearts together with our child before our child is born so that by the time our baby gets here, our child already has an advocate: a mother. God knows that because we took part in the *miracle of creating this new human* we will love and defend our child forever because they are ours and we are his mother. We knew our child before our child was here. *God did this*. He establishes mothers and blesses our role. Countless women have expressed throughout history that the days during which their bodies were creating new lives inside were the most cherished days of their entire lives!

Yet even with God placing great value upon the female role, far too many women in our culture, *even churchgoing women*, do not want to take part in this *holy act* of motherhood. For various reasons which are acceptable by *society* and by those around them, women reason out whether they want to be with child or not. The women want to *plan this event around their career* or personal lives or even *ministry plans*. They want convenience. They find other good things to be doing with their time and feel they have far too much to offer the rest of the world than to be wasting their prime years parenting a *group of children*.

I have been in *countless* Bible studies and have listened to the women who have a couple of children and who now don't know what God wants them to do with their lives. They wonder what their main purpose in life is supposed to be. They are struggling with the questions: *What am I here for? What is my purpose? What does God want from me? What will make me happiest?* When I tell them that their purpose is motherhood, they look at me as if I am crazy. They tell me, "*This is too basic; God has to want me to do more than this with my life.*" It's not that they can't do other things and shouldn't be adding fun to their lives, *but women don't get it!* Why do we want to make something hard that is so easy? Women keep wrestling with where they fit in, and instead of enjoying their role they continue to look for a greater purpose than *nurturing, loving and expressing their femininity through motherhood*.

We can't help it—we are met with these lies everywhere we go, *even at church*. I believe that every time we go to church, mothers should be honored with an almost royal-like focus for our daily task of raising the next generation. We cannot *escape* the fact that in today's world many fathers travel and are not home, and many women are *single moms*. Often children are being raised nearly exclusively by their mothers. Instead of mothers being saluted for their exhaustive, never ending 24-hour-a-day, 7-days-a-week role, women are *rarely exonerated except on Mother's Day*. It's not enough! Women should stand and be applauded every week, and if we did do this,

more moms would feel better about their role. Yet after Mother's Day, *the task of motherhood is overlooked.*

This is why women birth the number of children *they feel they can handle* and then move on. Birthing children is not seen as an *act of worship*, but instead something to do until God shows a woman what she is really here for. The very idea of giving God Lordship has been nonexistent. This devalued attitude toward motherhood has contributed to the *downfall of society.*

Masses of women have been deceived by the LIE of the enemy!

Paul knew that being a mother was vitally important to a woman's spiritual walk because it is a role that builds the future. This is why Paul told Timothy to encourage the young women to get married, have children, and manage their homes (1 Timothy 5:14). He also encouraged women to love their spouse and children, and older women to train the younger women to be happy mothers of children (Titus 2:4). Paul knew, as God also knows, that the most fulfilling avenue on earth for the *female is motherhood.* Yet today, among God's people, there are women who do not understand the deep role of motherhood because it has not been *taught to them!* It does not appear as a "*calling*" on spiritual gift tests, so females dismiss it as an option of importance. Women have not been shown the powerful significance of their *role as mothers.*

To God, birthing or adopting children and then training them to be Godly children IS the fulfillment of a woman's greatest dream (Proverbs 31:26)

Thank goodness, the great women of the faith like Eve, Sarah, Rebekkah, Jochebed, Hannah, Elizabeth, Mary, and Eunice saw that motherhood was their most valuable *lifelong contribution,* and they shaped history by the *fulfillment* of their role as a mother. I am praying the *next generation* will begin to see the deception that stole the fruit of several generations of women, and that a new generation will *re-establish* the role of motherhood God's way. This is why I wrote this book: *to attack this lie and to set women free to enjoy their true destinies.*

It takes *faith* to trust God with your physical body and with the possibility of giving up self-focused lifestyles. It takes women of faith like the ones in *Hebrews Chapter 11.* These women counted the cost and decided that following God was worth their effort. Building a family is a role that lasts far past this lifetime (*Psalms 127:3*).

Oh, to be used of God! This is why Rebekkah's brothers blessed her and told her: "*Our sister, may you increase to thousands upon thousands, may your offspring possess the gates of the enemies*" (*Genesis 24:60*). This is what the Scripture meant when it says that a woman will be saved through childbearing (1 Timothy 2:15). Her life is redeemed when *she gives birth.* She does not receive eternal salvation, but her life takes on its inherent value. As she gives of herself in childbearing and motherhood, a woman finds herself. When she allows her body to be used of God and submits to her role of birthing God's mighty warriors, she is taking part in the greatest contribution of her *lifetime!*

Ever since time began, God has been using women and wombs to bring life to this planet. Women are highly called of God to take part in this process with Him.

Ladies, the Lord values females and wants to celebrate our womanhood with us by blessing our lives with children. This great blessing was not something that God only meant for the ancient

women of the Bible. *This is a message for women of today; for women who are newly married, and for those who are not; for those moms who already have children and who serve in the PTA, and for women who home-school; for women who run their own businesses, and for women who love going to the mall; for women who enjoy decorating their homes, and for those who love making crafts with their children. This is a NOW message for today's females!*

I want to *encourage you* to dedicate your life to this task of motherhood: *conceiving, birthing and even adopting for some moms*, and then raising up these *mighty warriors* for God. It will take all of your faith to accomplish this, but it will be so worth it at the end of time. You will be happy that you spent your days mothering God's children and giving your life to this task. God is calling you to be the woman that He made you to be. You could easily spend your life pursuing other interests and personal fulfillments, but today if you will hear His voice and harden not your heart (*Psalm 95:8*) He will establish you (*Psalm 90:17*). This is something beautiful that needs to be embraced. Today God is asking you to consider serving Him by allowing Him to fill your womb with the children that He has specially planned for your womb to carry.

Women of God, there is power being released here, and it starts inside of a female's womb. The calling of motherhood is the highest calling for women! Few realize how powerful their motherhood calling is.

FEMALES ARE BRINGING LIFE TO THIS PLANET!

Females are the *stars* on the stage of life. They are the ones who get to present God's *newest* gift to the world—a human child—and that child can only come through a female womb that has been lent to God.

God is calling ALL females. *Are you a handmaiden of the Lord who is willing to let God give you the joy of children? Will you allow Him to let you experience motherhood as you lay down your desires for His? You will never be happier when you choose to allow God to give you the children in His plan.*

Do not be afraid . . .

I know that for many of you, your heart is agreeing with this message, but you are scared. This is *understandable* fear. Most women do not want to be pregnant nonstop, and the enemy will tell you that this is what will happen if you allow yourself to believe God in this area of your life. The enemy is so afraid that you might heed this message of the Lord and *create mighty warriors* who will *spiritually* defeat him that he will try to use your fears to make you think that:

*You will not have a life outside of diapers and bottles.
You will not have any money.
Your health will go to pot.
You are crazy to obey God.*

This is what the Lord says to you:

Do not fear, for I am with you.

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*Do not be dismayed, for I am your God.
I will strengthen you and help you.
I will rescue you with my righteous right hand (Isaiah 41:10).*

The Lord knows your fears and the lies that the enemy tells you. He also knows the plan that He has to bless you and to make you happy. As the lover of your soul God wants you to submit your will to Him, to trust Him with your physical body and your life. Because *you love Him*, don't you want to obey Him and be open to the possibilities of what He might do through your willing *submission*?

"For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord, "Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).

Put aside the lies of the enemy and say, *"Yes, I will trust You, God! Give me the children that you planned for my life!"*

Borrow my womb? Since men do not have one, it's kind of hard for me to relate to this. I guess it's like sharing your soul with God; now that would be powerful. 1. Many women today, even church going women, seem to be hesitant about motherhood. They do not seem to desire the role that God intended for their lives. Why do you think this is so? How did your own mother view the role of birthing children?
2. Do you have any personal fears about motherhood? Make a list of the things that excites you about pregnancy and what parts do not particularly appeal to you.
3. Read Isaiah 64:8; then express what this statement means to you: As each woman gives of herself to God, she helps to fulfill His desire to bring to earth the generations of mankind. The wonder of birth allows women to participate with God in fulfilling His vision for mankind. Through the miracle of birth, women can experience His creative power as new life passes through their bodies and comes to this planet!
4. Read Luke 1:28-38. The life of Mary presents a beautiful picture of God's calling on the women to be the creators of new life. [Read Luke 1:28-38.—this is already on the previous line.] This encounter presents a perfect example of how Mary had to receive God's vision for her life and had to submit to her calling on earth. Have you received God's vision for your life as a woman, and to this wonderful calling of motherhood? Why or why not? What part are you struggling with?
5. Historically we say that a woman "gives birth." The Scriptures say in Luke 2:7 "Mary brought forth her firstborn son." Throughout history women have participated in the act of giving birth. How does a woman "give" in the birthing process and how can this be viewed as being "holy"?
6. The Bible talks about wombs. Read Judges 13:5, Psalm 139:13, Isaiah 49:1, Jeremiah 1:5, Luke 1:15, John 3:4. Jesus (God in human flesh) came to earth through a woman's womb. Why do you think God chose the womb of the women as the only doorway to earth?
7. Read Psalm 139:15, 16. What do the Scriptures mean when they say, "My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed body." From this verse there appears to be a precious and holy secret place set aside for both God and babe. Obviously, it is a place of great mystery. What is your impression of the secret place, where is it, and what is happening there?
8. God has chosen not to have a womb unless He uses yours. This is obviously a wonderful privilege. How does it make you feel to have been born a female?
9. The last several generations missed out on this ancient path of allowing the Lord to give them children. Are you finding that today's generation has a greater desire to have children?

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10. After gaining a new understanding of the female purpose and calling, what does it mean for a female to surrender herself to this process of Birthing God's Mighty Warriors? If you are female, how are you feeling called to surrender yourself? If you are male, how could surrendering her body affect your wife's attitudes?

11. As God forms new life in her womb (Psalm 100:3), the Lord gives the woman the added pleasure of meeting His creation before anyone else can. Her pleasure is to experience God's creation while it is happening inside of her body (Genesis 18:12). This pleasurable bonding time is God's way of saying, "Thank you" to the female for allowing Him to use her physical body. How does that make you feel to be born female?



I believe that trusting God with our family size is God's way of molding our lives into something beautiful. Selfishness has no rightful place, and wherever we are selfish it will be revealed. There is simply no way for anyone to be pregnant multiple times and not bear the fruit of love. The giving that it takes to be pregnant even one time bears fruit. This walk of trusting Him is God's way to teach us how to know the fellowship of His sufferings. I have been married 27 years, and I have been pregnant and/or nursing for most of my marriage. Out of 320 months of marriage, I have NOT been pregnant for only 57 months. I loved going to the doctor and telling him that my last period was March 1985!—as often I do not have a normal period between births. Sure there have been rough times when I have questioned God and wondered if I was doing the right thing with my life, but then I would go on a walk with my children, and the things they would say as we spent time together and the laughter we had would renew my strength once again, and I would remind myself, "I am the most blessed woman in the world!"
